Scripture: Genesis 19:26

"But Lot's wife looked back, and she became a pillar of salt."

A Thought:

One of the finest voices in the music industry and for many years the diva of pop music was to appear at one of the toniest music awards shows in the world....she never made it. Less than twenty-fours preceding the walk on the red carpet Whitney Houston was dead. As of this writing the circumstances of her death are still unsure. What we do know that for two decades or so she was like a vessel wallowing in a stormy sea. Her life was the warmth of a comfortable ship basking and indulging in the luxuries it offered while the waves were the demons that gave it no rest. Whitney was no stranger to the Gospel. New Hope Baptist Church was her spiritual home and her soloist presentations became the launching pad to her singing career. She became the darling of the music and entertainment world...with that came fame, money, sycophants and drugs. Not unlike the rest of us mortals we never learn...Luke 17:33 *"Whoever tries to keep his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life will preserve it"* Remember the cities of Sodom and Gomorrah? The cities were going to be destroyed and Lot and his clan were told to leave Sodom with a warning not to look back. Lot's wife had other ideas...her physical body moved on but her mind, heart and soul did not...Genesis 19:17. Hence, she suffered the consequences.
